

Recommended Extra-Biblical Legal Guidelines for Our Time

Core Values Underneath the Guidelines

- **Proportionality** (penalties match harms; avoid needless escalation).
- **Protection of the vulnerable** as a first principle.
- **Restoration where possible**, containment where necessary.

1) Due Process and Fair Trial Protections

A justice system collapses when people fear it more than they trust it. Procedures are the bridge between moral intent and fair outcomes.

- **Presumption of innocence** and clear burdens of proof (criminal: beyond reasonable doubt; civil: preponderance / clear and convincing where appropriate).
- **Right to counsel** (or trained advocate) for accused and for victims in sensitive cases.
- **Independent judge / panel** with conflict-of-interest screening; mandatory recusal rules.
- **Anti-bribery enforcement**: declare gifts, audit decisions, punish bribery attempts.
- **Transparent written findings**: decisions must cite evidence and reasoning, not vibes.
- **Appeals process** and post-conviction review mechanisms (new evidence, DNA, recantations, procedural error).
- **Witness reliability standards**: corroboration rules, contamination prevention, protections against intimidation.
- **Evidence preservation**: chain-of-custody, tamper-evident storage, retention timelines.

2) Sexual Violence: Victim Protection, Evidence, and Humane Procedure

Many ancient texts discuss sexual wrongdoing, but modern societies must handle trauma, power dynamics, and evidence with care. A humane system avoids re-victimizing the victim while still protecting the innocent from false accusation.

- **No punishment for victims** for reporting; reporting is never treated as “impurity” or guilt.
- **Trauma-informed interviewing**: trained investigators, minimal repeated retellings, recorded statements where lawful.
- **Medical & forensic access** promptly (rape kits, STI prevention, emergency contraception where lawful, counseling).
- **Protective orders** and relocation support when safety is at risk.
- **Consent definition**: affirmative, freely given, reversible; coercion nullifies consent (threats, intoxication, authority pressure).
- **Power-differential rules**: teacher/student, boss/employee, clergy/penitent require special scrutiny or prohibition.
- **Evidence standards** that do not rely on stereotypes (what a “real victim” looks like).

3) Child Protection: Safety, Exploitation, and Mandatory Safeguards

Children cannot negotiate risk the way adults can. A moral society builds extra guardrails around them.

- **Mandatory reporting** for credible child abuse disclosures (with safe channels and protections against retaliation).
- **Age-appropriate consent rules:** children cannot consent to exploitation; clear statutory protections.
- **Child labor safeguards:** maximum hours by age; hazardous work bans; schooling requirements; rest periods; workplace inspections.
- **Child marriage prohibition** or strict minimum age aligned with modern human rights norms.
- **Online safety:** criminalize child sexual abuse material; require swift takedown and reporting procedures.
- **Guardian accountability:** penalties for neglect; resources for struggling families; prevention first, removal only when necessary.

4) Proportionality and Sentencing Principles

If punishment is disproportionate, it becomes injustice in the name of justice.

- **Graduated penalties:** warnings, fines, probation, restitution, community service, custody only when needed for safety.
- **Restitution priority:** when feasible, repair the victim's harm (medical costs, lost wages, property restoration).
- **Alternatives to incarceration** for nonviolent offenses (treatment, supervision, restorative circles).
- **Humane confinement standards:** no torture, no degrading treatment, health care access.
- **Sentencing consistency:** guidelines to reduce arbitrary outcomes across judges.

5) Self-Defense, Force, and De-escalation Rules

A society must define when force is permitted and how to minimize escalation.

- **Clear self-defense standard:** imminent threat, necessity, proportional response; duty to retreat where safe (policy choice).
- **De-escalation training** for security/police; body cameras or equivalent accountability where lawful.
- **Use-of-force continuum:** verbal → nonlethal → lethal only as last resort.
- **Independent review** after serious injury/death involving authority use of force.

6) Evidence in the Modern World: Digital, Forensic, and Scientific Integrity

Modern cases often hinge on data rather than eyewitnesses. Integrity standards prevent “spooky” evidence from becoming superstition.

- **Digital evidence policy:** warrants where required, minimization, metadata preservation, device imaging protocols.
- **Forensic lab standards:** accreditation, blind testing, error rate disclosure, independent audits.
- **Expert witness rules:** disclose limitations; prohibit overstating certainty (e.g., bite-mark style overclaims).
- **Statistical literacy** training for judges/juries on base rates and false positives.

7) Governance Ethics: Conflicts, Transparency, and Anti-Corruption

Even good laws fail under corrupt administration.

- **Conflict-of-interest disclosures** for officials and judges; public registry where safe.
- **Procurement transparency:** competitive bidding, audit trails, whistleblower protections.
- **Term limits / rotation** for high-power roles to reduce capture.
- **Freedom of information** defaults (with narrow privacy exceptions).

8) Mental Health, Competency, and Humane Treatment

A moral system differentiates malice from incapacity, and it treats illness without cruelty.

- **Competency evaluations** before trial; capacity standards for consent and contracts.
- **Diversion programs** for treatable conditions (substance use, psychosis) when public safety allows.
- **Crisis response alternatives:** trained mental-health teams as first responders when appropriate.
- **Least restrictive care:** prioritize voluntary treatment; involuntary holds only under clear danger standards.

9) Restorative Justice: When Repair Beats Revenge

Some harms are best addressed through repair, accountability, and reintegration, not only punishment.

- **Restorative conferencing** for eligible offenses with victim consent.
- **Structured apology:** admission, remorse, restitution plan, monitoring.
- **Community healing:** support groups, mediated dialogues, reintegration milestones.

- **Boundaries:** not used for coercive, severe violence cases unless victim-led and safety-confirmed.

10) Economic and Labor Ethics: Exploitation, Safety, and Dignity

Scripture contains moral direction about fair wages and honest scales; modern societies need concrete standards.

- **Minimum wage / living wage benchmarks** (policy choice), timely pay, wage theft enforcement.
- **Workplace safety:** hazard controls, reporting channels, inspections, injury compensation.
- **Anti-discrimination** protections in employment and housing.
- **Child labor protections** (see Section 3) and strict hazardous work bans.
- **Consumer protections:** truth-in-advertising, fraud penalties, clear contracts.
